Message from the President, ICA-AP

ICA, a global networking organization, is a worldwide representative of co-operative organizations of all kinds. ICA is also the custodian of cooperative values and principles and its principal role is to provide forum for the exchange of ideas, experiences, concerns and trade among co-operatives.

ICA over the years has been lobbying with the governments for the creation of favorable policy environment for the development of cooperatives and advising necessary improvements in the cooperative legislation for better regulation of the cooperatives.

Cooperatives are now significant economic and social actors with a membership of approximately 800 million people throughout the world. The primary benefit of cooperatives as we all know lies in their instrumentality in enabling people with limited individual resources in a market economy to pool their resources to acquire the economies of scale usually only attainable by larger, well-financed market players.

Cooperative enterprises are uniquely characterized by the qualities and processes such as member-owned; democratic management; driven by a balance between profit motives and the interests of their membership and the community. As such, cooperatives are idealistic form of corporate structures and it is never easy to follow the path of idealism due to self-interests that often become more dominating than the common interests. But the successes of co-operatives in different parts of the world prove the feasibility and effectiveness of value based economic enterprises.

The world, as we all know, is facing a major crisis that is economic, social and cultural but is also a *clear crisis of values and ethics*. The global recession, that began only a few months ago, has spread with a speed that we have not experienced since the Great Depression of the 1930's and it is becoming increasingly worse, with strongly-felt repercussions, not only on our standards of living, but also on perspectives for medium to long term development.

At this critical hour, several avenues of approach need to be considered seriously both by the Governments and the Co-operatives. They include:

- 1. Reaffirming and deepening our commitment to ethical and co-operative values and renewed emphasis on their relevance to business activities.
- 2. Strengthening cooperation between cooperatives at all levels national, regional and international.
- Strengthening and expanding knowledge networking, education, training and research at national, regional and global level.
- 4. Strengthen cooperatives as effective businesses, able to compete equally with the other business frameworks, particularly in this time of crisis.
- 5. Recognition by Governments about the important and special role, which cooperatives can play in the face of today's crisis.

Time has come when we need to reassess the importance of cooperatives in balancing the national, regional and global economy after the global economic meltdown. Companies that make significant profits but don't share the bounty with customers will find it tough to survive. The seismic shift with interventions ranging from nationalization to salary capping are enough to prove that THE CHANGE IS DESTINED and any company that could be perceived to be acting against the public good will fall in the line of fire and the mandates rather than voluntary measures will become the norm because in an interconnected world we stand or fall together.

I strongly feel that the time is most opportune to garner policy support of the Governments in the Asia Pacific region for promoting co-operatives as an ethical alternative of significance. I am glad to lead the region where co-operatives are emerging as a force to reckon with and the governments are overwhelmingly supporting the idea of inclusive growth through cooperatives.

The year 2008 witnessed a series of meaningful interventions facilitated by the dynamic team of ICA-AP under the leadership of Mr. Shil Kwan Lee, Regional Director of ICA-AP. I am happy to lead the region and present the 2008 report card of ICA-AP for your kind perusal and remarks.

Message from the Regional Director, ICA-AP

It gives me enormous pleasure to present the 2008 Activity Report of the ICA Asia Pacific.

ICA-AP was actively engaged in several cross-sector initiatives that carry great potential in terms of creating wider understanding of the co-op business model and stimulating development of cooperative initiatives as solution to the current challenges being faced by the world.

Some of the significant activities towards achieving this were, Government – Co-operative Dialogue held in Abu Dhabi in June 2008 to execute the Declaration of 8th Ministers' Conference on Cooperative Legislation and Policy held in Kuala Lumpur in March 2007, 5th Asia Pacific Cooperative Forum to understand cooperative advantages in the Global Economic Crises, Draw strategy for Cooperative Development and Legislation in Cambodia, Workshop on setting up University/Campus Co-operatives in Iran, and International Conference on Co-operative Tourism.

Alleviating the plight of the poor is of paramount importance for sustained development of the region. To achieve this, hunger, malnutrition and deprivation need to be eliminated. The poor need to have access to opportunities and be empowered to shape their own destiny for present and future generations. All this will require cooperation and the shared vision of both developed and developing cooperative in this region.

Economic cooperation is vital for the development process. Integrated regional and sub regional cooperation not only enables countries to enjoy greater complementarities and economies of scale, but also contributes substantively in building synergy and networking, an important precondition for sustainable economic development and prosperity.

ICA-AP is all committed to advocate the role of Cooperatives in attaining inclusive growth of economy and to provide effective networking forum for the exchange of knowledge, experience and business interests among members of ICA-AP.

ICA-AP Regional Assembly, 2008 Cooperative Advantage in the Global Economic Crisis

The 8th ICA-AP Regional Assembly was held at Melia Hotel in Hanoi, Vietnam on 5th December 2008. The meeting of the Regional Assembly was chaired by Mr. Li Chungsheng, Chairman of the Regional Assembly. 195 participants from 24 countries and three international

organizations attended the meeting. The joint opening ceremony of 2008 Regional Assembly and Co-op Forum was held at My Dinh National Convention Center on 3rd December which was attended by more than 900 people.

The inaugural address was delivered by H.E. Nguyen Phu Trong, Chairman, National Assembly of Socialist Republic of Vietnam. ICA-AP revised its rules according to the new rules of ICA approved by the Special General

Statement Issued at the 2008 Regional Assembly

Cooperative Advantage in the Global Economic Crisis

International Co-operative Alliance (ICA) that represents the global co-operative community, since 1895, and presently consisting of more than 800 million individual members has issued an open letter to the Governments of the G8 expressing the shock and serious concern on the Global Economic Crisis triggered by the melting down of some of the giant global financial structures.

It is a fact that vast amounts of taxpayers' money has been committed by many Governments to control the impact of *economic crisis created on account of predatory speculative practices of corporate giants*. The chain reaction of the financial disorder has started seriously impacting the regional economy of Asia Pacific in the form of business losses, retrenchments, liquidity crunch etc. thereby making weaker segments of the society more vulnerable and fragile than before.

Considering the deterioration of the situation day by day, WE, the representatives of ICA member co-operatives from the Asia Pacific region, apprehend that the crisis may engulf our region also and accordingly take the note of negative growth of economy with likely serious repercussions on the stability of the global economy.

Co-operatives being the value-based enterprises with unique blend of economic and social responsibilities soaked with a different ethos that employ 100 million people across the world need to be considered as a preferred option to stimulate the economic growth.

Co-operatives worldwide have been known as secure, stable and sustainable models of business

enterprises owned and controlled by the people who in pursuit of their common economic need pool their resources for common good.

Co-operatives being different form of business models as compared to the capital-intensive corporate structures are not linked with stock markets because they rely on members' funds for a realistic value; and are not subject to manipulation and greed since the members of their communities control them.

Co-operatives are the businesses where the profits are not just distributed to their shareholders, but are returned to those active members who transact with the business of the co-operative, thus keeping the wealth generated by local businesses in the local community for the good of the local environment and families.

Co-operatives do have the inherent features of being modest and realistic in planning the growth of the business with *manageable control on costs and aspirations* giving them a greater power of resilience.

In order to contain ill effects of the global economic recession, WE the representatives of co-operatives from the Asia Pacific region strongly recommend that significant role of co-operatives in the process of economic recovery should be given due recognition by the policy makers at global and national level and therefore urge upon the governments to establish good partnership with co-operatives to protect economically vulnerable population so as to minimize the impact of global economic meltdown at the ground level.

members of the ICA Asia Pacific Standing Committee and said that the new system in long run would definitely increase the membership base of ICA and eventually make co-operatives appreciate about the merits of active user members in development of cooperatives.



Co-operative-Government Dialogue held in Abu Dhabi, UAE

A "Government-Cooperative Dialogue" in conjunction with 2nd Cooperative Forum of GCC countries was jointly organized by ICA-AP and the Ministry of Social Affairs, Government of UAE at the Abu Dhabi National Exhibition Center from June 1-3, 2008 under the patronage of H.E. General Shaikh Mohammed bin Zayed Al Nahyan, Abu Dhabi Crown Prince and Deputy Supreme Commander of the UAE Armed Forces, to finalize the framework for the

implementation of the Declaration of 8th Ministers' Conference on Cooperative Legislation and Policy, held in Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia in March 2007.

Ms. Mariam Al Roumi, Hon'ble Minister of Social Affairs, Government of UAE inaugurated the event on 1st June 2008. Mr. Ivano Barberini, President of ICA together with the Secretary General of Gulf Cooperation Council presided over the Opening Ceremony.

The Minister of Social Affairs, Ms Mariam Al Roumi said that the government promotes co-operatives as an alternative to investor-owned private sector and that both are integral to the foundation of economic growth and development in a country. She further stressed that operatives should play an important role in the diverse and innovative sectors such as construction, health, education, tourism, insurance and others Mr. Ivano Barberini, President ICA, referred to the advantages of cooperatives in carrying out the task of micro-economic development with a strong flavor of social responsibility, emphasized on the harmonious relations between cooperatives and called upon the delegates to discuss in depth the role of co-operatives in tiding over the crisis of natural

disasters, food insecurity and the threats emerging from global warming.

The Secretary-General of GCC expressed the need of enacting uniform legislation for cooperatives in the GCC nations and appreciated the role of ICA in this task.

Papers were presented at the workshop on Governance in Co-operatives by Mr. Sanjiv Chopra; Social Responsibility of the Cooperatives by Mr. Zulkifli Mohammad: Security through cooperatives by Mr. T. Haque; and Multifunctionality of Cooperatives by Mr. Won-Byung Choi, President of NACF, Korea.

There were more than 110 delegates from 25 countries participated in this special event hosted by the Ministry of Social Affairs, Government of UAE.

Recommendations at the end of the Dialogue in Abu Dhabi

The Dialogue between Governments and Cooperatives from 26 countries in the Asia Pacific region concluded with the following set of guidelines to implement the Declaration of 8th Ministers' Conference on Cooperative Policy and Legislation:

- Government should recognize cooperatives as institutions playing important role in national economy.
- There should be a consistent national policy on cooperatives to facilitate inclusive growth of economy for attaining more holistic and balanced socio economic growth of a country,
- Appropriate support measures for co-operatives, both legislative and fiscal, should be introduced and carried forward in general and also in innovative sectors like infrastructure building, service industry, formal schooling, education, health care, women and youth empowerment, disaster mitigation and preparedness, food crisis and climate protection,
- The text of the cooperative policy and law should be in clear and simple terms for better appreciation and understanding of the members of cooperatives.
- Pre-registration audit for cooperatives, need for approval before registration, need to meet certain minimum standards must be in accordance with the viability norms required in local context,
- Legislation on cooperatives must protect

- democratic control of cooperatives and insist on professional management of cooperatives by clearly setting out who decides the policy and who executes the policy,
- The promoters and regulators of cooperatives must be adequately trained and groomed for their work with special service conditions to remain motivated for their difficult and challenging task,
- Institutional characteristics of cooperatives should be made visible by ensuring practices of effective governance, greater responsibility towards community and society and multiple functioning of cooperatives,
- Cooperatives should reassess their strengths, core competence and comparative advantages in emerging market economy,
- Cooperatives must staying away from party politics so that co-operatives could not be used for pursuit of political careers and become the instruments for implementation of political programs,
- Cooperatives need to aggressively market the cooperative advantages that evidently distinguish them with other corporate structures,
- Cooperation among cooperatives at local, national and global level must be explored by using ICT and providing online information on trading of commodities and services and maintaining a knowledge bank to bring harmony in the co-operative laws of different countries

Banuvene Kanmaitotoya, Permanent Secretary to the Ministry of Industry, Tourism, Information and Trade of the Government of Fiji, Mr. Agnideo Singh, Chair of the Fiji Teachers' Union

Thrift and Credit Co-operative Society and Dr. Ropate Qalo of the University of South Pacific, Suva, also spoke at the Conference. The Conference was attended by 85 delegates from all parts of Fiji, Papua New Guinea and resource persons from Korea, India, Japan, New Zealand and ICA-AP.

An International Conference on Cooperative Tourism was jointly organized by ICA Asia Pacific and RICEM, Jaipur on the 14th & 15th of October 2008 at Hotel Ramada. The event was mainly sponsored by IFFCO. *The theme of the Conference was "Friendly Tourism through Co-operatives"*. The Conference was inaugurated by Dr. N.S. Gurjar, Minister of Co-operatives, Government of Rajasthan, and presided over by Mr. Rajiv Agrawal, Managing Director of NCDC.

Secretaries of Co-operatives to the Governments of Rajasthan and West Bengal, Registrars of Co-operatives and

Directors of Tourism from Rajasthan, Goa, Jharkhand, Kerala and Himachal Pradesh attended the Conference. Besides, there were representatives from the National Coop Federations and tourism related coops from New Delhi, Goa and Mangalore.

Presentation outlining the concept and integral components of Coop Tourism and Tourism with Conviviality was made by Mr. Rajiv I.D. Mehta, Director

Christopher Imbsen of Dunira Strategy, UK. Policy & Strategy – to overcome challenges before tourism industry – Focus on SAARC Region was presented by Mr. Sanjeev Chopra.

Case Studies on tourism related activities of co-operatives in Japan, Korea, Malaysia, Sri Lanka, Iran and India were presented by delegates. Networking solutions to position Tourism Co-op as a reliable and responsible brand was jointly addressed by Dunira Strategy and TICA. 3rd Training Course on Promotion of Sustainable Enterprises for Rural Women

The International Cooperative Alliance-Asia and Pacific [ICA-AP] in collaboration with the JA-Zenchu [Central Union of Agricultural Co-operatives of Japan] and the

Institute for the Development of Agricultural Cooperation in Asia [IDACA] carried the 3rd Training Course on "Promotion of Sustainable Enterprises for Rural Women" from 15th August to 20th September 2008 in the Philippines and Japan. The main objectives of the

study visits to agricultural cooperatives in Gifu Prefecture of Japan. Lecture-cum-practical field study visits assignments were combined to impart necessary knowledge to the participants on the working of women's associations and the general activities of agricultural co-operatives in Japan.

Ministry of Agriculture, Forestry and Fisheries (MAFF); Mr. Kenjiro Miyazaki, Managing Director of IDACA; Mr. K. Twelve women participants – two each from China, Indonesia, Malaysia, Nepal, Philippines and Thailand attended the Training Course. An end-of-the Course Evaluation was conducted at the conclusion of the Training Course.

Training Project on Capacity Building for Marketing

The 1st Training Project for "Capacity Building for Marketing- 2008" was formally inaugurated on 24th July 2008 at IDACA, Japan by Mr. Yamaguchi Toshiya, Section Chief, Int'l Cooperation Division, International Affairs, Dept., Ministry of Agriculture, Forestry and Fisheries, Government of Japan. The Ministry of Agriculture, Forestry and Fisheries (MAFF) of the Government of Japan funded the programme. The main objectives of the training project were as follows:

- To study marketing methods for farm products by theory and case study;
- To study the methods for the rural development Nineteen participants – two each from Brunei,
 Cambodia, Laos, Malaysia, the Philippines and Vietnam and three from Indonesia and four from Thailand attended the

Training Programme.

The emphasis during the Training Project was on the methods and techniques adopted by various organizations and JA group in distribution of agricultural products and marketing business in Japan.

At the Valedictory Session, Mr. Miyatake Fuminori, Assistant Director, Int'l Affairs Department, Minister's Secretariat, (MAFF), Government of Japan, Mr. Yasuyuki Kobayashi, Assistant Manager, WTO/EPA Office, Agricultural Policy Department, Central Union of Agricultural Cooperatives (JA-Zenchu), addressed the participants. The participants also held country-wise group discussions and prepared brief reports on the experiences gained by them. An end of-the-Course Evaluation session was also held.

The 2nd ICA Japan Training Project for Capacity Building for Marketing was also held in Japan during 05-30 November, 2008. There were 20 participants from 9 ASEAN countries.

- All co-operatives should collect and provide information on best practices in respect of cooperative legislation;
- Capacity-building of women through various media forms be ensured by co-operatives;
- Strengthen partnership with men towards gender equality and women empowerment;
- Training programmes of co-operatives should include gender awareness and family enrichment sessions;
- The ICA should ensure a time line for the compliance of recommendations by the members in the region.

subscription formula which is at present based on business turnover and the proposal of the Restructuring Working Group (RWG) is based on total membership. So the

subscription formula ought to be worked out very carefully. He further said that the new ICA Subscription Formula would be applicable from January 2009 onwards. The year 2008 would be a transition period.

The Standing Committee discussed various aspects of the new Membership Subscription Formula and agreed to. send Recommendation to ICA Board for its consideration. Mr. Shil Kwan Lee also informed the meeting that the current "Strategy and Priorities of ICA-AP" would be over by end of 2008 and new Strategies and Priorities for the year 2009-2012 have to be prepared.

Project on Promotion of Sustainable Model of Agricultural Co-ops for Poverty Alleviation of Farmers

The project, which is supported by AGRITERRA of Netherland, was scheduled to be operational in Afghanistan, Cambodia and Laos. However, due to procedural delays at the level of respective governments in Afghanistan and Laos, the project could be operational only in Cambodia. The principal objective of the project is to evolve a workable sustainable model of Agriculture Cooperatives by sensitizing the policy makers and farmers in selected areas of the country.

The important activities undertaken by the project in Cambodia included:

Income generating activities in target cooperatives: Income generating activities with particular focus on women self help groups were initiated in target cooperatives to enhance the economic potential of the economy. On the basis of their understanding of the business concepts and assessing the local market potential,

these co-operatives started grocery shops selling petrol, animal feed, insecticides, pesticides etc. The total beneficiaries of this activity were 223 males and 82 females.

Entrepreneurship development programme: The project conducted entrepreneurship development programmes, as a result of which three cooperatives, viz. Somroung Premprey, Chivapheap Rong Reung Kimrieng and Bankong Angkor took initiative to start the economic activities e.g. dress making, processing paddy for consumption, rice marketing businesses, vegetable pickle making,

and rice milling businesses. The project granted 400 Euros to each co-operative as capital support. The profit earned by the target co-operatives is shared among all members.

Besides this, other prominent activities included, comprehensive capacity building programmes for co-operative leaders, Board members and members of Agricultural co-operatives in the areas of Financial Management, Marketing and Micro-finance activities

Cambodian agricultural cooperative, a national level workshop was convened as an important intervention of the project. After extensive deliberations of two days, the

workshop produced important recommendation on:

- 1. National Strategy of cooperative development.
- Suitable Framework of Cooperative legislation for Cambodia.
- 3. Supportive steps required to catalyze the process of cooperative development in Cambodia.

These recommendations will be helpful to the Government of Cambodia to map out future strategies for the promotion of cooperatives as an instrument of economic development.

ICA's Intervention in Mapping the Scope of Co-operatives in the Economy of Maldives

In order to draw a framework for the involvement of cooperatives in conventional and innovative sectors through a set of strategic initiatives in Maldives, ICA Asia Pacific held two days brainstorming session with the officials of the Ministry of Economic Development & Trade, Ministry of Atolls and officials of co-operatives and Island Development Committees on 10th & 11th September 2008.

Maldives has recorded remarkable economic growth over the past two decades, especially compared with the rest of the South Asian countries and is on the threshold of graduating from a Less Developed Country (LDC) status to the middle income group.

Maldives economy is dominated by two sectors; tourism and fisheries generating an estimated 31 percent of GDP but with an increasing regional disparity between northern and southern atolls. Consequently, the country is experiencing rising unemployment (14%) especially among the youth (33%).

Although there is still great scope for tourism market

development, the country's product line appears vulnerable. Therefore, the concept of cooperative tourism is of great relevance.

The Director Development ICA-AP made a presentation on new perspective on co-operatives, co-op legislation and policy in the region and shared examples of a few successful co-operatives in the region. Discussions were held on "Role of Co-operatives in Economy of Maldives". The following conclusions were drawn after the discussions:

- ICA would provide technical input in rewording the law for the co-operatives.
- ICA would provide a framework for the setting up of a National Cooperative Development Centre in Male.
- ICA would provide technical support in the development of cooperative ventures of various kinds in Maldives.

The Government of Maldives will involve ICA-AP as the technical resource agency for the development of cooperatives in Maldives.

ICA/IFFCO/NCC Pilot Project on Empowerment of Youth and Women through Co-ops in Sri Lanka

The ICA-AP/IFFCO/NCC together started a Pilot Project on 'Empowerment of Youth and Women through Co-operatives' in Sri Lanka for a period of 1 Year i.e. October 2008 to September 2009.

In order to implement the project the following would be carried out as has been outlined; a Pilot district would be identified in Sri Lanka, and thereafter a format would be developed to conduct base line survey of the target groups so as to assess their needs and constraints. Once it is finalized, the coordinators and volunteers would be inducted to conduct the base line survey made by the Director Development, ICA-AP and General Manager, NCC. Following this, there would be compilation and analysis of the survey findings which has to be done by the end of December 2008. As a next step there would be thematic workshop to empower the youths and women through group based small enterprises funded by local Rural Banks which is to be done by as early as January 2009, and

finalization and appraisal of the proposals at the end of the workshop. The schedule for implementation of the proposals – would be from Feb. 2009 to Sept. 2009 and simultaneously there would be monitoring of the implementation and facilitation for the desired outcome. As the last step of the exercise, there would be workshop on the lessons learnt and strategic policy initiatives for the replication of the interventions by October 2009.

NCC has agreed to contribute local cost by providing its training premises for the induction, review and thematic workshops and local communication and transport cost for the meetings. ICA will provide technical support in the form of designing the survey formats, benchmarking, curriculum and manual for the training of trainers and members of the community and networking at international level.

IFFCO has agreed to provide the financial support to the extent of 80% of the total cost of the project.

Co-operative History The Rochdale Pioneers

Co-operatives started out as small grassroots organisations in Western Europe, North America and Japan in the middle of the last century, however, it is the Rochdale Pioneers that is regarded as the prototype of the modern co-operative society and the founders of the Co-operative Movement.

In 1844 a group of 28 artisans working in the cotton mills in the town of Rochdale, in the north of England established the first modern co-operative business, the Rochdale Equitable Pioneers Society (photo). The weavers faced miserable working conditions and low wages, and they could not afford the high prices of food and household goods. They decided that by pooling their scarce resources and working together they could access basic goods at a lower price. Initially, there were only four items for sale: flour, oatmeal, sugar and butter.

The Pioneers decided it was time shoppers were treated with honesty, openness and respect, that they should be able to share in the profits that their customer contributed to and that they should have a democratic right to have a say in the business. Every customer of the shop became a member and so had a true stake in the business. At first the co-op was open for only two nights a week, but within three months, business had grown so much that it was open five days a week.

The principles that underpinned their way of doing business are still accepted today as the foundations upon which all co-operatives operate. These principles have been revised and updated, but remain essentially the same as those practiced in 1844.
